NEW ANNOUNCEMENTS AND IMPORTANT REMINDERS

#### **IMPORTANT DATES**

We are looking forward to welcoming back our Grade 6 Hybrid students next week. As a reminder, Group A students will return on Monday, March 29 and Group B students return on Thursday, April 1. If you were unable to join the Grade 6 Hybrid Orientation this week, you may view <u>presentation</u> here.

Schools will be closed for Spring Break from Friday, April 2 through Tuesday, April 6. Students will return to classes on Wednesday, April 7.

## STAYING CONNECTED

As students return to the building, we continue to focus on ensuring the safety and wellness of our students not only in their daily activities, but also in the event of an emergency. It is important for all HCMS families to complete their Family File in HCPSS

<u>Connect</u> so we have updated contact information and so families receive all school communications.

HCMS and HCPSS frequently send updated information to parents/guardians via email and text. Please be sure that your <u>Family File is up-to-date</u> and that you have opted into text messages to ensure you receive all messages. To opt into texts, text "yes" to 67587 from the cell phone listed in your Family File. If you need assistance updating your Family File, please contact our front office at 410-313-6929.

## HEALTH CHECK REMINDER

We are excited to continue to welcome back students in person. To ensure students are healthy enough to attend in-person instruction, parents/guardians are to perform a symptom check every day before the student leaves home. A student having any of the following symptoms should not be sent to school and may continue to access their classrooms virtually if they are well enough to do so:

1 of the following: New onset cough, shortness of breath, or difficulty breathing; New loss of taste or smell;

## OR

2 of the following: Fever over 100.4 or chills within the past 24 hours; Fatigue; Muscle or body aches; Headache; Sore throat; Congestion or runny nose; Chills or shaking chills; Nausea or vomiting; Diarrhea.

Additionally, students who have been in close contact (within less than 6 feet for a cumulative time of more than 15 minutes over the past 24 hours with or without a mask) with anyone who tested positive for COVID-19 or is suspected of having COVID-19 (exhibiting COVID- like illness and has not tested negative after exhibiting symptoms) should not enter any HCPSS building.

Parent/guardians will assess their children for symptoms of COVID-19 illness and refrain from sending/transporting them to school until after they have been symptom-free at least 10 days after the onset of symptoms, have no fever for at least 24 hours without the aid

of fever-reducing medication, and have continued improvement of symptoms and /or medical consult with their primary care physician.

## MESSAGE FROM THE SCHOOL NURSE

If your child is returning to school and will need medication dropped off at the Health Room, please contact HCMS School Nurse, Mrs. Casey, at 410-313-6934 to schedule a time.

If you have been notified by the Health Room about immunizations, you will not be able to attend in-person school without proof of immunization.

## HCPSS DIGITAL EDUCATION CENTER VIRTUAL INFORMATION SESSIONS

The Howard County Public School System is considering a virtual school option for students in grades K-12 who wish to remain virtual for the 2021-2022 (upcoming) school year. Once finalized, the Digital Education Center program will give students the option to access synchronous (real-time) instruction and digital assignments while receiving support services from the student's districted home school.

The HCPSS Digital Education Center (DEC) is currently in the planning and design phase. The DEC would allow students to take all classes and earn credits virtually while maintaining a relationship with their assigned home school. The final DEC scope and options are subject to funding, staffing and final Board of Education approval.

## UPDATE YOUR FAMILY FILE

We still need many families to complete their Family File for the 2020-2021 school year. We have begun calling families who have not yet completed Family File to offer assistance. If you have questions on how to complete the Family File, please call the school at 410-313-6929.

HCPSS uses Family File for parents/guardians to provide emergency information. **Parents/guardians must verify and/or update information** <u>annually</u> for each child and can do so by logging in to <u>HCPSS Connect</u> and selecting the Family File tab and then clicking on Family File.

Once logged in, parents/guardians will be asked to provide or update the following information:

- Student information
- Parent/guardian contact
- Emergency contacts
- Medical information
- Arrival/dismissal procedures
- Media release (photo approval)
- Data confidentiality
- PTA/PTSA directory

Changes of address may not be made through Family File. If you have recently moved, please contact your child's school as soon as possible.
