NEW ANNOUNCEMENTS AND IMPORTANT REMINDERS

RISING 6TH GRADE VIRTUAL ORIENTATION

HCMS will hold a Rising 6th Grade Virtual Orientation on Monday, May 17 from 2:00-3:00 p.m. The orientation will be held during the school day and students will access the meeting with their class using the Google Meet code: **HCMS-Orientation**. A copy of the orientation presentation will be available on our website after next Monday.

SPRING MAP TESTING

Spring MAP Administration will be held on Wednesday, May 19 and Wednesday, May 26 (in-person & virtual) from 8:30 a.m.-10:30 a.m.

MAP Q & A

What is MAP and Why are students taking it?

MAP is the Measures of Academic Progress assessment. Most students in grades 2-8 will take the assessment in the area of reading and math. The data from the MAP assessment will help schools and teachers measure growth from the Fall MAP

administration to the Spring MAP administration.

Should my child participate?

Yes. However, if your child is in 8th grade ELA-GT either semester 1 or semester 2, they are exempt from participating in MAP Reading on May 19. Please note if your child is in a high school assessed math course during semester 1 or semester 2 (regular or GT Geometry, Algebra 1, Algebra 2) they are exempt from participating in MAP Math on May 26.

What device should my child use to participate in MAP?

The same device your child is using to attend virtual and in-person classes.

How will MAP take place?

Students will be logging into their Cougar Time groups with their teachers. Once there the teacher will guide your child to the MAP testing site by providing a direct link and testing session code.

Will MAP impact my child's grades?

The MAP assessment does not affect grades and the difficulty adjusts depending on how your child responds. It is normal for students to only answer about half the questions correctly.

Where & When will MAP Reading take place?

With your child's current virtual or in-person Cougar Time class from **8:30 a.m.- 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, May 19.**

Where & When will MAP Math take place?

With your child's current virtual or in-person Cougar Time class from **8:30 a.m.- 10:30 a.m. on Wednesday, May 26.**

HEALTH CHECK REMINDER

To ensure students are healthy enough to attend in-person instruction, parents/guardians are to perform a symptom check every day before the student leaves home. A student having any of the following symptoms should not be sent to school and may continue to access their classrooms virtually if they are well enough to do so:

1 of the following: New onset cough, shortness of breath, or difficulty breathing; New loss of taste or smell;

OR

2 of the following: Fever over 100.4 or chills within the past 24 hours; Fatigue; Muscle or body aches; Headache; Sore throat; Congestion or runny nose; Chills or shaking chills; Nausea or vomiting; Diarrhea.

Additionally, students who have been in close contact (within less than 6 feet for a cumulative time of more than 15 minutes over the past 24 hours with or without a mask) with anyone who tested positive for COVID-19 or is suspected of having COVID-19 (exhibiting COVID- like illness and has not tested negative after exhibiting symptoms) should not enter any HCPSS building.

Parent/guardians will assess their children for symptoms of COVID-19 illness and refrain from sending/transporting them to school until after they have been symptom-free at least 10 days after the onset of symptoms, have no fever for at least 24 hours without the aid of fever-reducing medication, and have continued improvement of symptoms and /or medical consult with their primary care physician.

12-15 YEAR OLD VACCINE CLINIC

Twelve-fifteen year olds are now eligible for the Pfizer vaccine. Text **438829** with your zip

code and it will list 3 sites with available appointments.

HCPSS uses Family File for parents/guardians to provide emergency information. **Parents/guardians must verify and/or update information annually for each child** and can do so by logging in to [HCPSS Connect](#) and selecting the Family File tab and then clicking on Family File.

Once logged in, parents/guardians will be asked to provide or update the following information:

- Student information
- Parent/guardian contact
- Emergency contacts
- Medical information
- Arrival/dismissal procedures
- Media release (photo approval)
- Data confidentiality
- PTA/PTSA directory

Changes of address may not be made through Family File. If you have recently moved, please contact your child's school as soon as possible.
